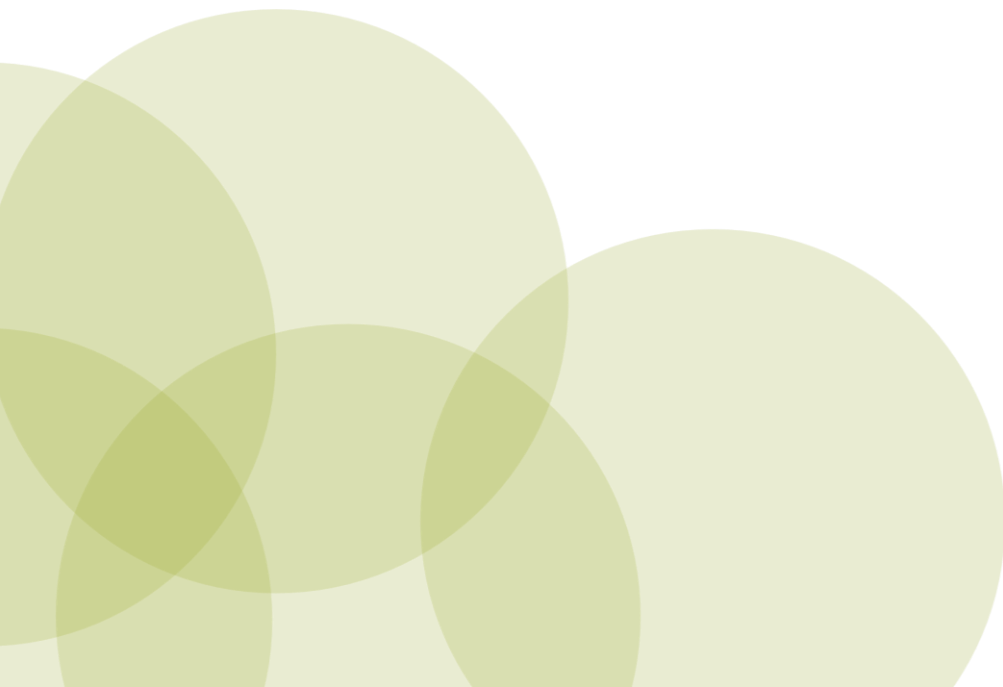

The Civic Canopy transforms the way pivotal issues are solved by creating a culture of collaboration across Colorado. As a community-based nonprofit, the Canopy's work connects diverse groups of people seeking change in their communities and equips them with tools to create meaningful and lasting impact. The research-based Community Learning Model reinforces the Canopy's three-part platform that: builds connections through shared technology, builds capacity through training and technical assistance, and builds a movement through engagement and advocacy.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Civic Canopy team actively engaged in the development of an updated business plan for the organization. Utilizing expertise from partners at Slalom and **Allen's organization**, the Canopy is creating a three-part platform to support collaborative efforts across Colorado that includes building connections through shared technology, building capacity through training and technical assistance, and building a movement through engagement and advocacy. The team is currently working to design a new organizational structure to ensure future success.

Building Connections Through Shared Technology

Civic Network

This online tool is designed to support networks, collaboratives, organizations, and individuals who strive to improve their communities through collaboration. The tool supports collaborative efforts and engages partners in discussion and information sharing across issue areas and geographies.

Within a month of launching Civic Network, it included 123 individual profiles and 26 networks.

Building Capacity Through Training and Technical Assistance

The Civic Canopy Collective Impact Summit

The Civic Canopy hosted its first multi-day Collective Impact Summit in December in partnership with Tamarack Institute. This event brought together 215 collaborative leaders from across Colorado and beyond. Participants engaged in learning opportunities varying from whole group keynote presentations to smaller workshop sessions and one-on-one connections during networking breaks. Each day was highlighted by a keynote presentation or plenary which grounded the learning community with common content.

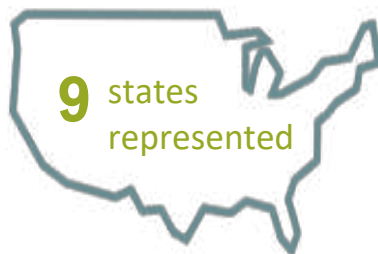

Online Trainings



The Civic Canopy hosted over a **dozen webinars** reaching **hundreds of partners** on a wide range of topics including transformational community engagement, use of technology tools that enhance collaboration, introducing collective impact, and shared measurement through Results Based Accountability.

Individualized Support



The Civic Canopy provided individualized facilitation and technical assistance to over 40 organizations and community groups across Colorado such as Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO), and partners in Prowers, Larimer, and Denver Counties.

Network Stewardship



The Civic Canopy supported five Denver and statewide networks focused on improving population wellbeing including the SHARE network, the Early Childhood Colorado Partnership, CO9to25, Colorado Afterschool Partnership, and the Civic Health Network.

The Civic Canopy engaged **over 300 community members in Denver** to participate in and lead community-driven efforts designed to improve individual, neighborhood, and community health and wellbeing through a Health Equity Learning Series, the SHARE Network, and EastSide Unified.
